HELLO

I have driven on 1-70 recently and every time I started to pass a slower vehicle, there was a car, truck, van, or something being driven hard right behind me. These drivers were in a big hurry and to get me out of the way they had their front bumper so close to my rear bumper it was nearly impossible to see the make of the vehicle.

Now, I will admit what anyone that has ridden with me knows, I am not a slow driver. I do, however, try to keep my speed at a reasonable rate. This does not seem to satisfy many other drivers. They are in such a hurry that they just cannot seem to wait.

Hurry here and do something then hurry there and do something else. More and more people seem to fall into the "hurry, hurry" mind set. No one wants to wait. On the highway this leads to road rage and to people doing crazy things.
